

The Pastor's Corner

One of the most common and popular devotions associated with this season of Advent is the Advent wreath. As we prepare for our celebration of the birth of light shining in the midst of darkness on Christmas, lighting the candles on the Advent wreath each day helps us to anticipate this reality. The season of Advent takes place during the darkest time of the year, when days are at their shortest. But Christmas occurs just a few days after the winter solstice, when night is so much longer than day. So as we progress through the season of Advent, we light more candles on the wreath so that by the third and fourth weeks of Advent, light is greater than darkness, signaling the approach of that most holy day when we proclaim (in the words of the prophet Isaiah) that "the people who walked in darkness have seen a great light!" (Is 9:1). The circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes the never-ending life of God, into which we are given a share through the Incarnation. God becomes flesh in Jesus the Christ, who shares our human nature so that we might be raised up into God's own eternal life of love. The evergreen branches of the wreath reinforce this belief, representing a life which lasts forever. Finally, the four candles of the Advent wreath signify the virtues associated with this season - hope, love, joy, and peace. Advent reminds us of what we are called to hope for - a new world recreated and refashioned by God as a world saturated with love and peace, which will bring us nothing but joy. That new world is the ultimate destiny towards which history is moving, and we are challenged to bear witness to it by the way we live our lives in the present, as messengers and beacons of God's everlasting light and life!
